Cries of "Merry Christmas!", Bing Crosby's 'White Christmas' blaring in the stores since before Halloween and non-stop red and green contrast with the feelings of many people at this time of year. For those experiencing the recent or impending death of loved ones and for those whose families are in crisis, it can be a very isolated and dreary time. Every greeting and every song reminds the grief-stricken of how sad life is at this moment. Some of us can't put our finger on exactly why we feel as we do. It may be just this year, or a feeling that comes over us every holiday season. We feel sad, withdrawn and a bit lost. Traditions that may have been years in the making may be significantly changed or no longer do-able. We are blue. I get it. I get it from years as a nurse. I get it from years as a pastor. I get it deep in my heart right now as a sister grieving the recent death of her little brother, Mark. I'm having a blue Christmas.

Joy-filled worship, special service such as community concerts, Festivals of Lessons and Carols and children's Christmas programs do not meet everyone's needs. Oddly, as the atmosphere becomes more jingle and jolly, some of us sink deeper into a sense of disconnection. To fill this gap, we will be offering Blue Christmas, a service of solace. People who are not having a particularly merry Christmas this year and friends who support them are invited to come and sit with one another in a liturgy that speaks of the healing love of God.

Sunday, December 20, 2015 at 10a will be a simple worship of a variety of music and silence interspersed with readings from Scripture and prayers of solace and hope. Candle lighting, anointing and communion will be offered.

We may be blue yet as Resurrection people, we are not defeated! As we gather on the day before this dark winter's longest night, may we gain a greater knowledge of the One who loves us in sorrow and joy. May we discover that even when our feelings seem contrary to the jingle of the season, Hope reigns, Love wins, **God is with us and WE ARE NOT ALONE.**

The holy days are supposed to be a time of joy, parties and gatherings with friends and family. But the time can be difficult for persons dealing with:

Personal grief

Loneliness

Physical, emotional or mental illness

Financial concerns

Distance from family

Relationship challenges like separation and divorce.
